Hours: 21 hours/week - three days per week (days and hours are flexible

and can be negotiated to accommodate personal circumstances)

The program runs for 6.5 months and includes a 2 week induction, 5.5 month program and 2 week handover.

The 2 week Induction Program involves training, handover and shadowing opportunities. It is facilitated over 6 days, 3 days/ week -

Position Overview: Amnesty International Australia is seeking to recruit Campaign

Support Volunteers, for our Campaigns Support Team.

As an essential member of the Campaigns Support Team, you will be allocated to one of the teams related to our campaigns work.





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This currently includes the following areas: Refugees and the Game Over campaign; My New Neighbour Campaign; Community is Everything campaign and the Indigenous Rights Team; Individuals at Risk and the International campaign team.

You may be responsible for responding to requests for assistance from asylum seekers, refugees, people in detention and other individuals at risk in Australia and overseas. You may also be responsible for researching and preparing reports about human rights abuses in Australia and overseas, drafting submissions and policy documents.

The Campaigns Support Team is an excellent opportunity to gain valuable professional work experience and skills, receive weekly training sessions and represent one of the world's leading human rights organisations.

About the team:

Depending on which team you are allocated to, members of the Campaigns Support Team may be responsible for:

- Monitoring complex cases and, where appropriate, helping to advocate on behalf of detained asylum seekers, refugees, and other individuals at risk.
- Researching issues relating to refugee laws and policies in Australia and overseas and drafting submissions to assist the Refugee Advisor, preparing senate estimate summaries and political briefings.
- Providing project management and other assistance to campaigners and key campaigns.
- Researching issues relating to human rights abuses in Australia and overseas and preparing research reports to assist the Individuals at Risk and highlight cases of concerns to Amnesty International's researchers.
- Research various matters of concern relating to systemic human rights violations and work undertaken by the International Campaigns team.
- Analysing reports of human rights violations in Australia relating to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people and providing research support to the Indigenous Rights team and Community is Everything Campaign.





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Main Responsibilities:

- Respond to requests for assistance and manage cases by providing referrals to legal, migration, health, and welfare service providers;
- Research and prepare reports relating to refugee policy and human rights concerns;
- Assist campaigners for key campaigns as required
- Assist colleagues in other teams as required;
- Maintain case files as well as case management spreadsheets in accordance with record keeping policies and procedures; and
- Carrying out other ad hoc tasks and administrative duties as required.

Selection Criteria:

- Current or completed tertiary or post-graduate qualifications in a relevant field (eg. International/Government Relations, Development Studies, Law, Human Rights, Political Science, Social Sciences, Social Work, Business Studies).
- Excellent written and oral communication skills and cultural competency.
- The ability to work independently and as a member of a team.
- The ability to manage competing demands and high volume workloads.

Desired Criteria:

- Strong research and writing skills ie. experience researching and preparing country reports, submissions, policy briefings or articles for publication.
- Lived experience or experience working with people from refugee backgrounds, asylum seekers, people in detention, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders or clients with complex cases.
- Training and experience engaging with vulnerable people with mental health concerns.
- Case management or client service experience.
- Knowledge of the Australian Privacy Principles and experience handling personal and sensitive information.
